CAMPUS MAINTENANCE

John Wesley University maintains exterior lighting around all buildings and parking lots, as well as additional sidewalks and driveways. Any burned-out lights or other problems that hinder campus security should be reported immediately to the Dean of Students. While maintaining an attractive campus, ground crews keep shrubs and hedges trimmed with security in mind, especially near the apartment complex.

VICTIM'S GUARANTEED RIGHTS

The University will not voluntarily release your name to the public or media.

University staff will:

- ◆ meet with you privately, at a place of your choice, to discuss your situation in a completely confidential manner;
- ◆ treat you with courtesy;
- ◆ assist you with counseling;
- ◆ provide reasonable protection from the accused or any persons acting on the accused's behalf;
- ◆ continue to be available to you, to answer your questions, and keep you informed on the progress of your case.

EMERGENCY EVACUATION

When the fire alarm sounds, all students and guests must vacate the building until authorization is given to return. Fire drills are conducted at various times throughout the year in accordance with state regulations. Occupants are to cooperate with persons directing the drill and are to remain outside until the drill is completed.

WARNING:

North Carolina Criminal Law (General Status 14-2686) dictates a maximum fine of \$500 and/or imprisonment for no more than six months for persons found willfully misusing or abusing fire fighting equipment or giving false fire alarms.

DRUGS & ALCOHOL

Under no conditions will illegal drugs, alcoholic beverages or narcotics be permitted on the school premises, neither shall anyone under the influence of illegal drugs, alcohol, or narcotics be allowed on school property. No student or employee shall illegally own, possess, use, transport, distribute, manufacture, or sell any controlled substance while on school premises or during the time when the student or employee is participating in any university-sponsored activities.

WEAPONS POLICY

According to House Bill 1009, it shall be a Class 1 felony for any person to possess or carry, whether openly or concealed, any gun, rifle, pistol, or other firearm of any kind or any dynamite cartridge, bomb, grenade, mine, or powerful explosive as defined in G.S. 14-284.1 on educational property. It shall be a misdemeanor for any person to possess or carry, whether openly or concealed, any BB gun, air rifle, air pistol, bowie knife, dirk, dagger, slingshot, leaded cane, switchblade knife, blackjack, metallic knuckles, razors and razor blades (except solely for shaving purposes), and any sharp-pointed or edged instrument except instructional supplies, unaltered nail files and clips and tools used solely for preparation of food, instruction, and maintenance on educational property.

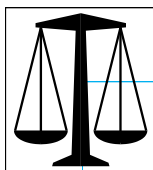

PROCEDURES FOR REPORTING SUSPICIOUS OR CRIMINAL ACTIVITY ON CAMPUS

Any suspected crime must be reported to the local police at one of the following numbers:

Notification should also be made to the Dean of Students as soon as possible.

If an emergency arises during business hours, call **911**, then inform university personnel as soon as possible. Please see the back of this brochure for after-hour emergencies.

COLLEGE HOUSING

John Wesley University maintains and provides beautiful on campus housing. The Shufelt apartment building contains 12 two-bedroom, two-bath units. Guests are allowed to visit if registered in the Dean of Student's Office; however, students need to be responsible to maintain this privilege.

All visitors must leave the apartments by 11:00 p.m. Sunday through Thursday evenings, and by 12:00 a.m. on Friday and Saturday evenings.
